YEAR 4 MULTIPLICATION CHECK MONDAY 2ND JUNE - FRIDAY 13TH JUNE

The multiplication tables check (MTC) is statutory for primary schools. The purpose of the MTC is to determine whether pupils can recall their times tables fluently, which is essential for future success in mathematics. It will help schools to identify pupils who have not yet mastered their times tables, so that additional support can be provided. Schools must administer the MTC to all eligible Year 4 pupils between **Monday 2nd June** and **Friday 13th June**. Just a reminder that the law states that a Head Teacher is unable to grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are **exceptional circumstances**.

We ask that parents complete a leave of absence form which is available on our school website or at the school office.

Please be aware that unauthorised absences on your child's attendance records could result in you receiving a penalty notice from the local authority.

5 days / 10 sessions unauthorised absence in a 10 week rolling period must now be referred for enforcement action. Parents who continually opt to pay the fine may face legal action.
